The two siblings could hardly be more different. On the one hand, there's Karl Moor, a non-conformist, rebellious young man with nothing but contempt for all around him. On the other hand, there's Karl's younger sister, Franza, who feels ugly and unloved because her father only has time for her brother, Karl. While Franza stays at home to maliciously plot against her father and brother, Karl takes to the woods to found a band of brigands. In their own ways, both siblings revolt against the social order. After years of brigandry, Karl returns home. Confronted by his sister's intrigues, he swears revenge and the family's ruination can no longer be avoided.

At the age of just 22, Schiller wrote a tale about the rivalry of two very different brothers which is bursting at the seams with drama, emotion and a desire for freedom. Come and lose yourself in a captivating theatrical evening of evocative, passionate drama, family tragedy and highly topical social critique.
